Dr. Hein is a mathematics instructor at El Camino. He received his MA from the University of Minnesota and his PHD from Columbia university in New York.



Mrs. Annette Williams, of Torrance, shares one of her favorite recipes with readers of the current issue of True Story magazine.

Mrs. Williams' recipe for Mince-apple Pie:
Makes one 9-inch pie
Prepare:
one 9-inch unbaked pie shell
Measure:
2 cups mincemeat
Spread evenly over bottom of pie shell. Place in refrigerator to chill.
Combine:
3 cups sliced apples
¼ cup light brown sugar, firmly packed.
Arrange on top of mincemeat in circular fashion. Combine:
¼ cup light brown sugar, firmly packed
½ cup flour
3 tablespoons butter
Mix with fingers to form crumbs. Sprinkle on top of apples. Bake in hot oven (425 degrees Fahrenheit) for 30-40 minutes. Serve warm.
