**Payroll Giving Plan
Endorsed by Executives**

These are the words of Roy W. Johnson, executive vice president, General Electric Co. The Community Chest, 1957-'58 Commerce and Industry campaign, is getting under way, and according to a study by the 1957 National Corporation Participation committee of the United Community Funds and Councils of America, Inc., he, like 16 other top executives throughout the United States, has found that the Payroll Giving Plan method of giving to United Funds and Community Chests is beneficial to everyone.

Employees, on the other hand, find that generous giving is easier under Payroll Giving. Each deduction is so small that its effect on the paycheck is negligible.


