

Thief Cleans Out Dress Shop Before It Opens

A burglar who couldn't wait for Ruth Griffen's Apparel Shop to open formally next week broke into the new store in Waverly and stole close to \$2,400 worth of women's suits, skirts, sweaters and dresses. It was the second robbery of its kind in two weeks.

The shop at 3810 Pacific Coast highway was scheduled to open its doors November 1, and was being stocked by its owner, Ruth Griffen.

The lock on the back door of the store in the Pacific Medical building was jimmied. The racks were cleared of \$1,000 worth of dyed to match pastel sweaters and skirts, and between \$1,000 and \$1,500 worth of dresses and suits. Sixty dollars in cash was taken from the register.

The thief, Mrs. Griffen said, "shopped very carefully. He took only the best I had."

Mrs. Griffen discovered the loss when she opened the shop Tuesday morning. She reported it to Torrance Police who were continuing their investigation.

New Plastic Fillings Replace Old Porcelain

"The porcelain fillings that I have in my front teeth are turning dark and are washing out. I have had them replaced twice already in five years. Isn't there anything I can do?" ... asks a young lady from Torrance.

In the last couple of years dentistry has developed a new plastic filling material to replace the synthetic porcelain or silicate cements as we refer to them.

These plastic fillings, according to our researchers, will maintain their original color for years and years and will definitely not wash out as the porcelain fillings tend to do.

The cost is only slightly more than for the porcelain fillings but the permanency more than compensates for any price increase.

It is possible to use these fillings on a biting edge where formerly it was impossible to place porcelain and where an unsightly gold inlay had to be placed.

In my own practice I have been testing this material for 3 years and I can finally say that they will stand up under the most severe wear and biting pressure.
