Alondra Park To Feature Tots Play Area

One of the finest children's playgrounds in Los Angeles County is now under construction at Alondra park and will be ready for use next spring, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn reported this week.

The new playground area is included in a major improvement program on the Redondo Beach side of the park, which also will result in the construction of a new bathhouse for the swimming pool, increasing parking, landscaping and park lighting.

A large triangular area southwest of the swimming pool has been designated as the location of the playground area. The sides of the triangle are approximately 300 feet in length. Supervisor Hahn said that the play area will be fenced off and paved with premix asphalt which will be covered with a colored mastic compound.

For the safety of children using the swings and other playground equipment, the equipment will be permanently fixed in place, with sand and tanbark placed underneath. Lawn areas will be planted at a number of locations within the playground.

A large number of items of playground equipment will be installed to provide fun for children of all ages, from tots on up to teen-agers, Supervisor Hahn stated.

This will include two sets each of large swings, small swings, tether ball posts, parallel bars, climbers and specially designed fiberglass bronchos. Other equipment will consist of four slides, two merry-go-rounds, three teeter sets and a traveling ring set.

Work on the playground and the general development and improvement of the southern portion of the park, particularly the area south and west of the swimming pool, is being carried out in accordance with Supervisor Hahn's program to develop Alondra park into one of the County's finest regional recreational areas. This is the third major project to improve the park in the past two years.
