Other well-known personalities, Jack Lockhart, Anita Freisheim, Eldridge Walker and James Wilson added to the professional finish.

The ballets taught by the local dancing teachers featured Vicki Marks, Paul Owsley, James Walsh, Dorothy LaSpina, Gladys Nauman, Myron Reynolds, Christie Sharp and Vincent Martinez.

Christine Weldon, as the leading "lady," and Stephen Stackhouse as the Nutcracker Prince, both developed the continuity of the story and completely won their audiences by their dancing and youthful charm.

In the last act eleven-year-old television star, Reba Waters, sang, as the Christmas Fairy, a haunting lullaby by Tschalkowsky.

L.A. State Has Record Number Of Teacher Candidates

Los Angeles State College had enrolled more students in teaching preparation programs than any of the 38 colleges and universities accredited for teacher education in California. Teacher candidates at Los Angeles State College numbered 1212.

The second largest number were enrolled at the University of California, Berkeley, 1195;

San Jose State College had 1027 in preparation; San Francisco State College, 983; the University of Southern California, 963; and the University of California, Los Angeles, 846.

This is the third year since supply and demand studies have been made that the largest number of candidates has been prepared by a state college.
