Water District Asks Knight To Call Special Session

Three recommendations designed to help solve some of the major phases of California's vital water problems have been made to Governor Goodwin J. Knight by the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California, it was revealed today by District Board Chairman Joseph Jensen.

The three points called for by the district include (1) a request that Knight call a special session of the legislature following the March budget session, and devoted exclusively to the problem of water rights and a Constitutional amendment to establish and preserve those rights.

Another is a request that a special item be included in the budget to cover the cost of engineering studies of a possible

project to bring water from the Eel river down the coast via a crossing at the Carquinez strait as the next possible project needed after the Feather river project; and (3) approval by the district of \$52,900,000 of the \$76,900,000 in the 1958-59 budget requested by the state department of water resources for the Feather river project. Budget items supported by the district board included the job of relocating the utilities at the Oroville dam site.

"The Metropolitan Water District board of directors feels that these recommendations, if adopted by the governor, would constitute a major step forward in finding the solution to many of the vexing problems confronting the state," Jensen declared.

The parcel was acquired by the State of California in connection with construction of the Harbor Freeway and was later deeded to the City of Los Angeles. It is encircled by Harbor Park, according to the Recreation and Park Department.
