

Locals Have Five Losses For Season

Defeated but undaunted, El Camino College will send its basketball quintet into the final two contests of the first round of Metropolitan Conference play this week-end.

Tomorrow night, the Warriors will engage the Renegades in an 8 p.m. tilt. The Caminitos will have everything to gain and nothing to lose in the northern city, being securely lodged in the conference cellar with a 0-5 performance background.

TIE FOR FIRST
The 'Gades are lodged in a four-way tie for conference supremacy, sharing a 4-1 won-lost record with L. A. Harbor, Long Beach, and Valley colleges.

Coach Gil Bishop's charges have risen to pre-season predictions thus far. Bakersfield, finishing in a tie for fifth last season, was tabbed for the first division in '58. The four-way tie for the first gives the Renegades just that. Reaching the semifinals in the Sam Barry tournament during the Christmas holidays, the Renegades were teammates, the Long Beach Vikings.

ONLY LETTERMAN
Mac Ellis, only returning letterman on the '58 squad, has proved the standout for Bakersfield today. Others expected to see action against the Warriors are forward Dave Wagener from '57 Utah frosh; Buddy Candy, Cruz Ortiz, Jimmy Granata, Roger Short, Vern Crissman, and Johnny Miller.

Santa Monica, hosts at Saturday night's 8 p.m. basket battle, is disappointed its followers during the first round of play. Having been tabbed for a first division berth this fall, the Corsairs are a scant one game above the El Caminitos. A Saturday night win by the Stanichmen will pull them into a tie.

ONE RETURNED
Sonny Smith, 6-1 forward, is the lone letterman returning from the '57 Santa Monica quintet. A product of Santa Monica High School, Smith was named to the second string All-Metro team last year. From the free throw line, he broke the college record by hitting on 74 per cent of his gift shots, averaging a 10.4 point total per game.

Small but fast, the Corsairs will also feature the play of All-CIF stars Tommy Bennett from Santa Monica High and Ned Eckert from Beverly Hills.

OPTIMISTIC COACH
Without a returning letterman, Coach George Stanich is optimistic regarding the Warrior future hoping for a reversal of the 1957 season, when the El Cams dropped from a near-perfect first round record to consecutive defeats in the second round, when top starters were lost to the squad due to grade deficiencies.

Fast starters, the Warriors have held first-half leads through the round, only to drop behind during the second-half play. Gaining experience during the first round, the Warriors anticipate winning at least four games in the finale, when they will have the advantage of meeting the opponent on the local courts. Only three first-round engagements were played at El Camino.

STARTS BRIGHT
Coach Stanich will start Mira Costa letterman Mike Bright and John Spohrer, who played All-League ball for Gardena in '57, at the forward spots this week-end.

Hawthorne's Kelly Kappen, who made All-Pioneer league honors last season, will start at the center post. Guards will be George Hale and Bob Hutton. Hale, a Gardena graduate, made All-Marine League honors in '54, prior to entering the service; Hutton, an All-Pioneer League guard last year, lettered in basketball, baseball, and track at El Segundo last year.

The Warriors will initiate second-round play against Long Beach on the home courts February 7.
