Ground Broken for New Church Bldg.

A special ground breaking service was conducted Sunday afternoon, to mark the beginning of a new educational and fellowship building for the Seaside Community E & R Church, United Church of Christ, 2304th and Ocean ave. The new building was designed by Waugh Smith, A.I.A., of the architectural firm of Killingsworth, Brady and Smith of Long Beach. It will have sliding panel doors which separate the classrooms of the nursery, kindergarten, primary, junior and senior groups and will include two lounges. The north wall of each room will be a sliding glass panel opening on a patio. This new addition will adjoin the present chapel and will be 120 feet by 21 feet and will cost approximately \$29,000. Among the guests present for the ground breaking service were Dr. John Flucke, president of the California Synod of the Evangelical and Reformed Church and pastor of Morning-side Community E & R Church of Inglewood; Mayor Albert Isen and J. A. Beasley, Planning Commission, Torrance. Others present were Roy Burt, president of the Consistory; Roger Schriefer, chairman of the building committee; William Adkins, past chairman; Waugh Smith, architect; Rev. Earnst Tischeuser, pastor of First and St. Paul's Church;

Mrs. Clyde Martin, superintendent of the church school; Mrs. Roger Schriefer, president of Women's Guild; Dick Evans, president of Churchman's Fellowship; David Tepas, choir president; Milton Eddy Saraceni, Senior Youth Fellowship president; Carol Eddy Saraceni, Junior Youth Fellowship president; Mrs. Dean Gulbransen, representing 21 charter members; Frank Tuttle, representing Boy Scout Troop 998, and Beatrice Aldred, representing junior confirmation class. A reception in the chapel given by the Women's Guild immediately followed the ground breaking ceremony. The building site of two and one half acres was purchased in January 1955. On January 22 men of Morningside Community E & R Church and men of Seaside Community E & R Church began construction on the present chapel. Following completion of the new Educational and Fellowship building it is anticipated construction will soon begin on a large sanctuary.

Lutheran Church Adult Religious Program Starts


