### UNIFORM CRIME REPORTS for the United States (Released September 26, 1957)

More major crimes occurred in the United States during the first half of 1957 than in any like period in the past. Police reports reflecting an 8.4 percent increase brought the national total of major crimes to 1,399,670 at the midyear point.

By June 30, the estimated total criminal homicides and assaults, robberies, burglaries, and other thefts exceeded the average for the preceding five years by 24.4 percent.

Increases occurred in all crime classifications, and particularly noteworthy is the fact that robberies increased for the first time since 1937.

Since first compiled in 1951, midyear crime estimates have increased 45.7 percent, which is 4 times the 11 percent increase in population in the same period.

Submitted by Joe Wilcox, Executive Secretary, YMCA of Torrance. I'd like to discuss some of the positive factors related to juvenile delinquency here in Torrance and on the American scene.

We have a problem.

It is a human tendency to generalize about that which we do not understand. And all adults have trouble understanding the younger generation. Generalizations about the kids of our community cannot be fair appraisals of the tens of thousands of individual human beings, each with their unique personalities, interests, needs, attitudes, habits, and problems. Even Cicero complained about "that new and wild generation" of thousands of years ago.
