"Y" outh Program Gets \$1,124 From American-Standard Plant

Benjamin Smith, chairman of the Torrance YMCA board of managers, announced today that the Torrance YMCA had received a check for \$1,124.50 from American-Standard. The check was presented to Smith by L. N. Gill, plant manager.

The American-Standard contribution represented a joint effort of the company, employees, and management personnel to support the local youth program of the YMCA.

The company gave \$250 of the total gift, and management personnel contributed \$328 to the YMCA. John B. Feltes, president of Local Union 218 International Brotherhood of Operative Plumbers, took a day off from his job at American-Standard to personally solicit all members of Local Union 218 employed at the plant.

Mr. Feltes' efforts and the generosity of the employees, resulted in an employee contribution totalling \$546.50, an average of \$2.09 per employee. The balance came from the other sources aforementioned.

Ben Smith, in accepting the check for the YMCA stated that American-Standard has been of inestimable value in maintaining the YMCA's youth service. Smith pointed out that three YMCA Division Chairmen come from the civic-minded firm. They are L. N. Gill, Century Club chairman; Mervin Schwab, Clubs Division chairman; William Speck, Church Division chairman. Smith said that 26 other American-Standard employees are serving as YMCA Campaigners in the \$30,000 YMCA Fund Drive.

Smith reported that the YMCA has now received \$14,000 toward

the 1958 goal. Although the drive was to conclude today, it has been extended in order to achieve the goal needed to serve more than 7000 youngsters.

Electric Street Sewer Completed

Sanitary sewers recently constructed in the alley north of Electric street, between Normandie and Vermont avenues, this week were officially approved and accepted by the Board of Supervisors according to Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.

Known as County Improvement project 1948-M, the sewers were installed through special assessment proceedings and had been recommended by the County Health Officer as a necessary health measure, Supervisor Hahn said.

Construction of the sewers started last November.

Carlson Heads Drive to Repeal School Tax

Oliver Carlson, noted educator and author, has been named state campaign director of the Californians for Public Schools' drive to return property of parochial, private, and sectarian schools to the state's rolls. John A. Owen, president, has announced.

Voters will pass on a constitutional amendment calling for this tax law revision in the upcoming November elections.

Owen pointed out that the measure to exempt these special schools from paying property taxes was passed by only a slight majority in 1952 after being rejected by the state's voters in earlier referendums in 1926 and 1933.
