Eleven graduates of the Harbor College Vocational Nurse program have passed the California State Board Vocational Nurse examination with high scores, according to an announcement made today by Montague M. Wadley, Chairman of the Division of Natural Sciences at Harbor College.

The vocational nursing program, which consists of five months' study at Harbor College and seven months' nursing at Harbor General Hospital, qualifies the graduate for the licensing examination given by the California State Board of Vocational Nurses. The program is also accredited by the National Association for Practical Nurse Education.

Persons interested in enrolling in the one year course, which will begin again in the Fall semester, should make arrangements for an interview as soon as possible by calling Harbor College.

Applicants should be eighteen years of age or older, be in good health, and have an interest in nursing. The number of persons in the class will be limited, and an early appointment is desirable.

"I have bad pyorrhea. What can be done for this?" asks Mrs. P. L. F. of Torrance.

Pyorrhea can be detrimental to the health of the patient. In addition it can have bad effects socially as well as socially.

To properly plan treatment of pyorrhea it is necessary to take full mouth X-rays. In severe pyorrhea X-rays reveal that it is best to extract all teeth and have upper and lower dentures.

Often, however, it is possible to keep the teeth and pyorrhea treatments are indicated. Part of the treatment involves the cooperation of the patient in several important phases as follows:

1. Pyorrhea is usually caused by improper diet. Therefore the diet has to be changed so it is proper and balanced.
2. The teeth need be brushed more thoroughly. Both diet and proper brushing technique instruction is given at our office.
3. Also missing teeth that cause teeth to drift and pack food between teeth aggravates pyorrhea.
4. And lastly, neglect and delay in proper dental care per se can cause pyorrhea to get worse.
