Thirteen year-old Dean Wright is one of the more experienced "professionals" to appear in the Palos Verdes Player's riotous comedy, "Strange Bedfellows," rehearsing under Mile Mid-dough's direction for a March 7 opening. Recently co-starred on TV's Telephone Time presentation of "Under Seventeen," Dean will soon be seen with Danny Kaye in the forthcoming MGM picture, "Merry Andrew." He has also appeared on Matinee Theatre with Jane Darwell, and Dr. Hudson's Secret Journal.

A student of Anne Sutton, prominent South Bay actress also playing a featured role in "Strange Bedfellows," Dean made his theatrical debut with the Gardena Theatre Guild. He was seen there with Miss Sutton in "Hansel and Gretel" and came under her tutelage as she encouraged the talented teen-ager to enter the Hollywood motion picture-television scene.

The captain, of 127 Via Sego, Torrance, said the site would be open from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. for all those who would like to visit the Army base. The launching area is located adjacent the Torrance Municipal Airport on Crenshaw Blvd.

"During the open house," the captain said, "conducted tours of the Nike base will be scheduled. The Nike system will be explained and demonstrated."

The Torrance site, one of 16 of the 108th Air Defense Missile Group which is responsible for the defense of Los Angeles, is open the first Saturday each month for public inspection.


