Lecture Series to Brief the Science Layman

Briefing the layman on various fields of science is the objective of the "Science for the Citizen" series of eight Monday evening lectures in Beverly Hills High School auditorium in March and April, coordinated and presented by Julius Sumner Miller, of physics, El Camino College.

The lectures, each by an authority in his field, are intended to give information about frontiers of achievement in several scientific areas.

The series starts March 3 with a lecture, "Concerning the Nature of Things," by Dr. Richard P. Feynman, California Institute of Technology. Dr. Allen P. Donovan, Ramo-Woodbridge Corp., discusses space technology March 10, while Prof. Arvo Van Alstyne, UCLA School of Law, considers legal aspects of space flight March 10.

Prof. Harold K. Ticho, UCLA Department of Physics, lectures on "Why Smash Atoms?" on March 24, and two weeks later, on April 7, Dr. Moses A. Greenfield, UCLA Medical Center, will speak on peaceful applications of atomic energy.

Automation will be presented by Dr. E. M. Grabbe, Ramo-Woodbridge Corp. on April 14. Dr. Robert S. Richardson of Mt. Wilson observatory will discuss possibility of life on the other planets April 21, and Dr. J. A. Campbell, Harvey Mudd College, will conclude the series with a lecture on crystal chemistry on April 28.

All lectures begin at 7:30 p.m.

J. EDGAR HOOVER, Director, Federal Bureau of Investigation

"Daily, news reports remind us of the rampaging reign of lawlessness and, particularly, of the shameful crime picture expanding throughout the nation. Not only has the number of juvenile offenders increased tremendously but so has the VICIOUSNESS of their crimes. The harmless prank has given way to the premeditated act of violence. Disrespect for lawful authority has blossomed into complete disregard for the individual rights of others.

The term "juvenile delinquency" is, of course, a misnomer. The large majority of cases involving juveniles has exhibited that the real delinquency originates in the home. Parental delinquency would certainly be a more descriptive term.

The family is the first great training school in behavior or misbehavior. Children develop a sense of right and wrong. The home becomes their first classroom and the parents serve as the first teachers for the inspirational education of youth. Here the spade-work is laid for instilling in the child those values that will cause him to develop into an upright, law-abiding wholesome citizen. He must learn respect for others, respect for property, courtesy, truthfulness and reliability. He must learn not only to manage his own affairs but also to share in the responsibility for the affairs of the community.

It is my firm conviction that only when the family returns to living as a unit will we be moving in the proper social direction. Any lasting corrective steps will have to begin at the cornerstone of our society—the home.
