Schools Get Aid on Funds

Assemblyman Vincent Thomas has requested Gov. Goodwin J. Knight to call a special session of the Legislature to consider future school financing.

Thomas said he submitted a resolution by the Torrance Unified School District, which asked that the Legislature provide for additional funds for school construction.

The Board of Education pointed out that the 1956 bond issue of \$100,000,000 is being depleted at the rate of \$5,000,000 each month, and that all funds will be used up at the end of this year.

The board pointed out in its resolution that this will impair school construction since the building program can not be handled on a local basis even though the district's maximum bonding capacity has been approved by the voters.


Thomas promised that he will make a personal call on Knight in efforts to impress him with the importance of the matter.

Care for a look at some unusual phones? Here are a couple of experimental types. You'll agree they're quite a change from the phones you use every day. So we've asked a number of people to try them out at home for a month. In the foreground is a new-style bedroom phone. The phone at left is even more unusual. The dial's built right into the handset. Naturally, it's too early to tell if either of these phones will ever go into regular service. But our aim is to find out what telephone users think of them. For what we learn from tests like this will help set the style of your future telephone.
