County Contracts with Six Private Hospitals to Provide Emergency Care

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn announced this week that the Board of Supervisors has contracted with six private hospitals in his district to provide emergency medical care to residents of county unincorporated territory and cities, except for the cities of Los Angeles and Inglewood, which have their own emergency medical programs.

Under Supervisor Hahn's administration, the facilities for emergency medical care have been greatly expanded so that immediate assistance is available to persons injured in traffic and other accidents and emergencies.

If the persons receiving the emergency care cannot pay, the County reimburses the hospitals.

"I am sure that parents will appreciate knowing that emergency medical care is close at hand for their children should an accident occur," Supervisor Hahn stated.

Under the contract system, it is not necessary for residents of the second district to travel long distances seeking emergency help.

He explained that residents of the City of Los Angeles should dial 116 in emergency to be connected with the receiving hospital.

Residents of other areas should contact the nearest emergency contract hospital, which are: Centinela Valley Community Hospital, 935 S. Flower st., Inglewood.

Daniel Freeman Memorial Hospital, 333 N. Prairie ave., Inglewood.

Hawthorne Community Hospital, 711 Grevillea, Hawthorne.

T. C. O'Jnes Medical Group, 2319 W. Compton blvd., Gardena.

Wilcox Medical Group, 6014 S. Western ave.

Bon Air Hospital, 120th and Broadway.

Emergency medical care is also available to persons living in the Gardena and Torrance areas through the Harbor General Hospital at 1124 W. Carson street.

"In an emergency situation, a call should be placed to the for those living west of Ver-Sheriff's office (Lennox station mont, Firestone station for those

east of Figueroa) so that immediate clearance can be phoned to alert the hospital of the emergency. If necessary, arrangements for emergency ambulance service to the hospital are made by the Sheriff's office," Hahn explained.
