Cancer Society Asks for Volunteer Fund Raisers

Need for volunteers to take part in the American Cancer Society's April educational and fund-raising Crusade was sounded here today by Mrs. John H. Stoddard, Torrance Residential Chairman, and her two co-chairmen, Mrs. Wilbur Chew and Dr. Eleanor Thill.

"We are rapidly completing plans for our door-to-door residential cancer crusade and urgently need volunteers to call on their neighbors to distribute vital cancer literature and accept contributions for the American Cancer Society," Mrs. Stoddard said.

"Our Residential Crusade is planned for the evening of April 22nd from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m., and we know many men and women will want to give 3 hours of their time to help in the fight against cancer."

Mrs. Stoddard asked that anyone interested in registering should call her at FA 8-8988, or Dr. Eleanor Thill at FR 5-9460. Mrs. Chew will also receive calls after 6 p.m. at FA 8-8957.

Some of the crusaders will be giving their time in memory of a loved one, a relative or a friend who has died of cancer, and in hope that others may be spared this fate.

The chairmen pointed out that mothers will have a very special reason for crusading to rid the world of cancer. "It is because more school age children are killed by cancer than any other disease," they said.

"Next to auto accidents, cancer is the greatest single killer of our children," Mrs. Chew added, "and it can and it must be eliminated from our midst."

She pointed out that "the great hope lies in research—research

to find the cause and cure of this dread malady."

"While this is a Memorial Crusade, it also is a crusade of Hope," Dr. Thill said. "Hundreds of researchers, financed by ACS funds are hard at work in hospitals, medical centers, and universities in an effort to find the answers to cancer and we are confident they will. Some tremendously promising experiments are now underway."

"The Salk vaccine was a demonstration of the efficacy of public support in defeating a dread disease and the same support should be given to cancer so that it can also be conquered," Mrs. Stoddard said.
