

Northrop Aide to Address Science Event
 Lee A. Ohlinger, chief of the computation and datamation center at Northrop Aircraft's Northrop Division, will be the keynote speaker of the science fair to be held at Narbonne High School, Lomita, March 20.

A recognized authority in the fields of atomic energy and automation, Ohlinger will address science fair visitors on "Science—Challenge or Mirage?"
 Designed as a timely discussion for students and adults, the talk will relate the dynamic future facing scientists in translating imaginative dreams into useful reality.
 A pioneer in the field of atomic energy, Ohlinger was responsible for the basic engineering designs for the reactors at Hanford, Wash., where plutonium for atomic bombs is produced.
 He has served as consultant to the Atomic Energy Commission and to the Argonne National Laboratory of the Monsanto Atomic-Electric Project at Oak Ridge.
 Approximately eight years ago he became involved in the new field of computing and automation, and is currently in charge of the computing and data reduction at Northrop where several electronic "brains" are in use.

High School Seen Despite Student Drop

Torrance will need a fourth high school by September, 1962, despite a slow down in new student enrollment.
 That was the statement of Dr. Warren Hamilton, director of special services for Torrance Unified School District, when he spoke before the Educational Advisory Committee Monday.
Western Section
 He said that the additional high school will be needed in the western section of the city.
 Dr. Hamilton said that enrollment increase this year will be less than the jump during one month in past years.
 This factor, he pointed out, will mean that school officials must be extremely accurate in their estimate of future needs.
Contracts Let
 He said that contracts have been let for the Calle Mayor and Jefferson schools, to house a total of 1187 pupils.
 The district will soon advertise for bids for four more elementary schools to accommodate a total of 2035 students.
 These are the Hamilton, Magruder, Lincoln and Yukon schools. One additional school is being planned now and additions to four others.
