Mayor Albert Isen and approved by the City Council.
A resolution passed by unanimous Council vote, asks local business firms to give job preference to Torrance residents whenever possible.
O. R. Trueblood, president of the Chamber of Commerce, reported that his board of directors has voted unanimously to cooperate with the program.
"Our organization is dedicated to the welfare of Torrance and its citizens, and therefore stands willing to cooperate in this manner," Trueblood said.
He said the Chamber is waiting for further recommendations from the Council to implement the program in order to provide more jobs for Torrance residents.

City Dads Irked by Mistake

Action to strike a disqualified candidate's name from the ballot was demanded by the City Council Tuesday despite an opinion that this is impossible.
Mayor Albert Isen asserted that someone must be responsible to check a candidate's qualifications in order that an error will not be repeated in the future.
He referred to the case of Bernard (Barney) Miller, who

withdrew from the race for city clerk Friday after he was questioned by City Attorney Stanley Remelmeier on his residential qualifications.
Miller, who admitted he has not resided in Torrance for the full year required by law, withdrew from the race.
Isen objected that it costs the city approximately \$50,000 to hold an election, and that if there is any contest over the results, this could become an expensive matter.
Remelmeier said that only a court order, or death of a candidate is sufficient cause to strike a name from the ballot which already has been printed.
