10-Point Campaign Platform Listed By J. A. Beasley, Candidate for Council

Declaring that Torrance is a big, urbanized city now and should adjust its operations accordingly to city-wide, long range programming, City Council Candidate J. A. Beasley submitted a carefully tailored election platform to the voters this week.

"We're a community of nearly 100,000 people," he pointed out, "but unfortunately there still are persons in this town who are against city-wide progress unless it benefits their special interests. If we are to assure ourselves of progress for all of the people, then we must have city-wide representation on the City Council."

Beasley, a Walteria resident, is a member of the City Planning Commission and a former member of the Recreation Commission. He is college educated in economics, personnel management, and municipal planning; is an active church worker; is married to a Torrance kindergarten teacher; is the father of three children, 11, 16, and 19, all in school or college; and is himself 56 years of age.

Beasley outlined his platform as follows:

1. Provide more parks and recreation facilities throughout the city for citizens of all ages.
2. Erect three adequate teen age centers in North Torrance,

Central Torrance, and South Torrance.

3. Increase library facilities to keep pace with the population growth and to accommodate a new surge of technical literacy.

4. Develop an adequate and permanent storm drain program for all of Torrance, based on sound planning and economics.

5. Extend Hawthorne blvd. south of Pacific Coast Highway to provide improved access to Torrance shopping areas for residents of the Palos Verdes and Rolling Hills areas.

6. Develop business and industrial frontage on the north and south sides of Torrance Municipal Airport in order to increase the city's income through lease fees and sales taxes, and to simultaneously create new job opportunities for local residents.

7. Install adequate controls and safety measures at Torrance Airport to prevent hazardous flying over nearby homes.

8. Use the city's general fund to pay all costs for street lighting and residential rubbish pickups instead of assessing individual residents and property owners


