

Ground Broken for Sports Auditorium

Official groundbreaking ceremonies Monday for the new Sports Auditorium at Exposition park brought to reality a long-cherished dream of the people of the Southwest, ushered in a new era for major indoor sports on the Pacific Coast, and at the same time put Los Angeles on the map for major conventions, trade shows and exhibitions.

Hahn, in whose district Exposition park is located and who initiated the Sports Auditorium when he was president of the Coliseum Commission in 1955, traced the history of the project from the passage of enabling legislation in 1955 to this week's groundbreaking.

He emphasized that the facility would be built and operated at no cost to the property owners of Los Angeles County.

The board, which wants her property as part of the new Hamilton Elementary School, has asked the sheriff to serve her an eviction notice if she does not vacate by the April 11 deadline.

Last week, Miss Swick presented petitions, representing 150 residents, citing that the location of the school is too dangerous because of speeding traffic.

The board is not scheduled to take action on the petitions until next Tuesday.
