Mercury March Sales Show Spurt Over February

Sales of new Mercury cars were higher in March than in any month since the 1958 models were introduced last November, and topped February sales by 32 per cent, it was announced by George S. Coats, field sales manager for Lincoln and Mercury.

This substantial increase reflects an upward trend which started with Mercury in mid-February, and which has been gathering momentum at a gratifying and steady rate, Mr. Coats said.

Mercury retail deliveries in March reflect the aggressive sales program introduced recently by a series of 66 meetings with dealers around the country and are the result of intensified merchandising programs that have been in effect for several months.

Amer. Standard Promotes Two to Fill Gill Post

American-Standard has announced the appointment of Douglas P. Baldwin to the position of plant manager, and the appointment of Lowell A. Bunnell to Superintendent of Manufacturing at the Torrance Plant.

Baldwin, formerly Superintendent of Manufacturing, succeeds Mr. L. N. Gill, who passed away March 23rd while on a business trip to Italy. Baldwin, originally from Roseland, New Jersey, graduated from Rutgers with a B.S. Degree in Ceramics, and following a tour of duty in the U.S. Navy during World War II, became associated with American-Standard on October 15, 1946, as a Ceramic Engineer at the Trenton Plant. He transferred to the San Pablo Plant on March 15, 1947, and to the Torrance Plant February 15, 1948. He became General Foreman of the local plant on January 1, 1957, and was promoted to Superintendent of Manufacturing on August 31, 1957. He is 38.

Bunnell transferred from American-Standard's New Orleans Plant to Torrance, arriving here to take over the position of Superintendent of Manufacturing on April 8, and states that his family will move to Torrance as soon as possible. He is originally from Medina, New York, graduated from Alfred University with a B.S. Degree in Ceramic Engineering, and served in the U.S. Air Force. He was originally employed by American-Standard in October, 1955 as a Ceramic Engineer at the New Orleans Plant, and was promoted to a General Foreman on October 1, 1957. He is 35.
