

### Torrance YMCA Leaders Map Future Program During Study Retreat

The Torrance YMCA held a unique week-end retreat last Saturday and Sunday in order to plan intelligently for the future. Parents and teen-agers from all phases of the local

YMCA program joined in a two-day conference at YMCA Camp Mozumdar to share their hopes and ideas for the local youth agency.

After exploring the present program, serving more than 5,500 local youngsters, the persons present then discussed their ideas as to what the Torrance YMCA should be doing in the future.

Some of the highlights among the decisions reached by representatives of the board of man-

agers, Adult Y's Men's Club, club leaders, youth members and parents were these:

1. Even more camping opportunities for Torrance youth of all ages.
2. Continuation of Saturday Adventure Clubs, particularly for youth not now involved in the several YMCA programs.
3. Concentration of effort in organizing and operating many new teen-age YMCA clubs for boys and girls, especially in the neighborhoods where recreational facilities are limited. The staff was instructed to spend major portions of their time on this necessary project in the coming year.
4. The group felt that a new and comprehensive building, including a swimming pool, gymnasium and club rooms, is very desirable but that good clubs and camps can be operated without

the great cost of such a building for another year or two.

5. The group felt that the "Y" is not telling its story of service and growth to the community. Efforts will be made to spread the news of achievements over the past 10 years as a local association.

Following the discussion regarding the future, the several groups divided to spend the remainder of the week-end in concentrated training for their various responsibilities with the Torrance YMCA.
