

Here are some tips on roasting this excellent cut of properly-aged beef. Add no water. Roasting is a dry heat method of cooking and if pan is covered or water added, the meat becomes a pot roast. Roast in slow oven... about 300 degrees. Use rack to hold meat out of drippings. Be sure fat side is up so roast will do its own basting. Use meat thermometer, putting bulb in center of largest muscle.

Plomert Nominated as Industrialist of the Year

Robert I. Plomert Jr., Torrance Civic and Industrial leader, has been officially nominated for California's Industrialist of the Year Award, it was announced today.

Plomert, manager of General Petroleum Property Tax Department, was nominated because of his many direct contributions to the general public and for increasing public understanding of the role and place of American business, according to a statement by President O. R. Trueblood of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce.

The award program is being sponsored for the first time this year by the California Museum of Science and Industry to bestow recognition for professional accomplishment on two Californians each year, one in the field of basic science, the other in the field of business or industry.
