

Rezoning of Industrial Tract Hit by Chamber

In a blast against "hodge-podge" development, the Torrance Chamber of Commerce today went on record as opposing the proposed rezoning of industrial property for apartment building. The chamber took its stand against an application for the rezoning of nearly 100 acres at the southwest corner of Crenshaw and Sepulveda blvds. from its present industrial zoning.

A second hearing on the request by Bjorklund and Smith to build apartments on the tract, with five acres on the corner set aside for commercial use, will be held by the Planning Commission June 4. "Industry is not attempting to encroach on residential property nor does it expect to be the victim of 'hodge-podge' development," declared O. R. Trueblood, president of the chamber.
