Manned Space Capsule Projected by Northrop

Northrop Aircraft Inc. has given its manned space laboratory program the company designation of Project BROOM (ballistic recovery of orbiting man).

A research and development proposal which calls for placing a recoverable manned space capsule into orbit within three years is being prepared for submission to the U. S. Air Force. Pending an Air Force decision, Northrop will continue Project BROOM studies on its own initiative, George F. Douglas, engineering vice president of the company's Northrop Division, said.

The Northrop proposal is based on the use of existing rocket propulsion systems to place the capsule in orbit.





Chest Tabs June Thank You Month

"Thank you" is the key word for June, the month set aside every year by the Community Chest to thank the many volunteers and contributors who gave their support to the health and welfare services of the Community Chest.

According to J. A. Robinson, chairman of the Harbor Area Welfare Federation Board, Community Chests and United Funds in Southern California raised a total of \$18,660,309 in their recent campaigns.

The 10 communities of the Harbor area, Robinson said, are part of the Los Angeles area campaign that netted \$10,123,359 for 167 services.

In all, 1041 member agencies of 67 federated fall campaigns in Southern California combined to report the record-breaking amount during this special "thank you" month.

Volunteer solicitors called upon a population of more than 7,000,000 persons residing in the 9564 square miles served in Southern California.

Here in the Harbor area, Robinson said, more than 4000 volunteers aided in the campaign in business and residential phases.

More than \$85,000 was raised, he added, and this does not include contributions from large firms and their employees, Associated In-group Donors, Permanent Charities Committee of the Motion Picture Industry and other large donations, such as those from National Supply's Employee Club.
