Strip Gets Improved Services

Not only will this shorten the time for such emergency service, but ultimately will result in a savings from the shorter distance for ambulance calls.

Arrangements with the county for such emergency treatment is in addition to the hospitals now maintained in San Pedro and Wilmington, Dr. Sebastian said.
