

# Councilmen Irate Over Cost of Attorney Fees

Cost of litigation came under attack by the City Council Tuesday when it grudgingly paid a \$250 bill.

The bill was the final payment to Charlton Mewborn, who had represented the city in its zoning battle with Don-Ja-Ran over its development of the bluff area. The case was finally settled out of court under a compromise.

"When we paid him \$2192, I thought we were through," declared Councilman Robert Jahn. "Why was it necessary for him to appear at Planning Commission meetings?"

Mayor Albert Isen said that City Attorney Stanley Remelmeier could have explained the compromise conditions to the

Planning Commission and the city could have saved Mewborn's fees.

In reply to questions, Remelmeier said that addition of a deputy city attorney to his staff would not cut down much expenses in hiring private attorneys.

He said the assistant will devote at least half of his time to prosecuting criminal cases. Later on, Remelmeier explained the city will have to hire a third attorney because of growing work and still retain private counsel on cases where they are experts in the field.

# South High Contract to Be Awarded

Bids for additions to South High School, including a football stadium, 14 classrooms, a library, additions to shop facilities, and a multi-purpose unit (cafeteria), will be awarded at a special Torrance Board of Education meeting on Monday at noon.

Apparent low bid with stadium was submitted by Paul W. Speer with \$1,945,000. The district's estimate was \$1,590,000.

Builders will present two bids one including all of the buildings and an alternate figure for all of the buildings except the football stadium and allied facilities.

The board will analyze the bids for the football stadium, lighting, and allied equipment to see whether they are in line with estimates and whether they would prevent future construction of additional classrooms.

The board will study the budget to determine whether enough money is available to build all needed classrooms, thus avoiding double sessions. If the cash is available and if the costs of the football plant are not too high, then the stadium probably will be built at this time. Construction of both the South and North High stadiums probably would be delayed if funds are not available.

The bid covers the third unit of buildings at South High, which is designed to house an eventual enrollment of 2600 students. The second unit of buildings, including a gymnasium and more classrooms now is under construction.

The library is designed to house more than 40,000 books for student use. Shop additions include drafting, handicraft and metal shop facilities.

# Sleep Teaching Lecture Slated

Frank E. Sundstedt will present a lecture on sleep teaching July 11 at 1 p.m. at the Bettle Thomas Studio, 1215 Crenshaw blvd. Sponsored by the Cambridge Institute of Self Improvement, whose local representative is Mae Pouncey, 1508 Date ave., the speaker will discuss a method of teaching while the person is sound asleep.

The method uses phonograph records played while the person is asleep.

The sleep instruction offers several subjects for children.

These include self-confidence, obedience, sharing, neatness, nail biting prevention, and good manners, among others.

Adults can learn how to acquire a magnetic personality, memory powers, sleep therapy, self-mastery, and other subjects.

The technique of sleep teaching will be described by Sundstedt in his lecture.

Blind children from three western states and Baja California will converge on the Foundation for the Junior Blind's summer camp in the Malibu Mountains during July and August. It is the only summer camp for sightless youngsters in Southwestern United States and Mexico.
