### College President, Family Will Reside in Torrance

Now at home at the desk which he will officially occupy tomorrow as president of El Camino College, Dr. Stuart E. Marsee anticipates with eagerness the day when his family will be "at home" in Torrance.

The Marsees, whose future residence in the Hollywood Riviera sector is now in escrow, await the sale of their Pasadena home before sampling life as permanent residents of the college community with their three sons.

For Audrey Belfield Marsee, the wife of the new college executive, coming to the beach area is the answer to a long-standing dream. A native of Portland, Ore., she has always enjoyed West Coast living, but is particularly fond of beach life.

"Everyone in the family enjoys swimming—even five-year-old Wayne," Mrs. Marsee noted with characteristic enthusiasm. The Marsees have already tested South Bay beach life and between the beach and the swimming pool at their prospective home, 358 Camino de Las Colinas, they expect to make swimming an integral part of their family life here.

The newcomers to the El Camino College area have spent the past 12 years in Pasadena, the last four and one half in their present home.

Mrs. Marsee, whose principal role is that of homemaker, has traditionally taken an active interest in the educational and social pursuits of sons Fred, 16; Jeffrey, 9, and Wayne. For the past year, she has served as secretary of the Parent-Teacher Association of Don Benito Elementary School, where Jeff completed his third grade work in June.

Active in PTA work since Fred's earliest school days, the new first lady of the college has also participated in Faculty Wives, the Council of Women's Clubs in Pasadena, and other women's organizations. In addition to swimming, she shares hiking and camping as favorite hobbies with the rest of the family. Another hobby is gardening, where roses bring a special twinkle to her lively dark eyes.

Like his mother, 16-year-old Fred is a native of Portland. He was a graduate of Marshall Junior High in Pasadena this spring. He is enthusiastic about enrollment in South High, Torrance, as a junior in September. At Marshall, which takes Pasadena students through the sophomore year, Fred received the Kiwanis Club award as the outstanding boy of his class at commencement exercises. A letterman in football, baseball, tennis and basketball, he was named Athlete of the Year in 1957 for his activities in the Babe Ruth baseball league.

An ardent Cub Scout, Jeff will become a fourth grader at Parkway School this fall. His natural hobbies, through family association and scouting activities, are hiking and swimming.

With his younger brother, Wayne, who will step on the long highway of education this fall as a kindergartener at Parkway School, Jeff is the proud custodian of the family pets, Chang, a lively black and white pup, and Smoky, the ebony cat.

Both Jeff and Wayne were born in Pasadena.
