Karl's Shoe Store Holds Grand Opening Today in New Shopping Center

Another forward step in the 52nd anniversary expansion program of Karl's Shoe Stores, Ltd., largest family-owned and operated firm of its kind in America, was marked today when the firm's newest store launched its grand opening sale at 5016 190th street. Sale prices are also featured at Karl's first Torrance store at 1281 Sartori avenue.

Plans for the event were announced by Russ MacDowell, who has been named manager of the new store, and Harry Karl, president of the shoe firm, with headquarters in Los Angeles.

"We are happy, in this 52nd anniversary year of further expansion, to extend to additional thousands the benefits of our low overhead, low mark-up policy of providing the best custom-made shoes at the lowest possible prices," Karl commented.

It is this flexible policy of gearing merchandise to economic trends and placing emphasis on goods rather than store fixtures, Karl said, which has enabled his 52-year-old concern to weather panics and depressions and become the largest family-owned and operated firm of its kind in America.

Karl recalled that the present Karl's Shoe Stores, Ltd., with its major stress on expert volume buying methods and minimum overhead distribution techniques, grew from one tiny cobbler's

shop founded by the family in downtown Los Angeles in 1905. Identified with the early business growth of Los Angeles, the firm was among the first to decentralize its operation, locating new stores in key areas of population expansion. There are currently more than 300 Karl's family shoe stores in the Western states.

Hull Tells Need For Bond Issue

"How many more in 1964?" was the question School Superintendent J. H. Hull posed to the North Torrance Civic Improvement Association Thursday night, as he told why the Torrance Unified School District has placed a bond issue on the ballot Oct. 14.

The money from the bond issue is needed, he said, to provide 300 new classrooms for Torrance's rapidly growing school population. Dr. Hull said that by 1964, enrollment is expected to climb from the present 23,500 to at least 32,600. The 300 additional classrooms and 147 now under construction would house the added students and minimize double sessions, he said.

Approval of the bond issue would give the Torrance School District the means to build the needed new facilities without raising the tax rate, he reported.
