Adult Classes Offered Now at Gardena High

The newly established Gardena Adult School will offer a wide variety of day and evening classes as its fall program begins for the first time Monday, announced William Johnston, principal. The school is located on 182nd street, between Vermont and Normandie avenues.

Adults from any area 18 years of age or older (no previous schooling required) are invited to enroll in Academic, Commercial, Industrial, Fine Arts, Music, Health Education, and Civic Education classes. There is no charge for instruction.

The expanded adult education facilities now provide a complete Counseling and Guidance service for adults wishing to complete their elementary or high school education. Credits toward these objectives are granted for work in other schools, paid work experience, military service, examination, and adult school classes.

Veterans, attending under Public Law 550, will now be able to enroll in courses preparatory to future Junior College or University work. High School graduation is also possible for veterans by successful completion of the GED (General Education Development) Tests and completion of United States History and Government.


