Southwest Area Gets Special Attention on Freeway Needs

The two-day hearings just concluded by the Joint Interim Committee on Highway Problems were designed to sound out community opinion on freeway construction priorities in the presence of state highway officials who sat with our committee.

These local meetings were a part of an over-all study being made by the committee in all major areas, to guide us in laying out a state highway system and to ascertain community reaction to present construction schedules.

The two areas of Los Angeles County to which particular attention was given were the San Fernando Valley and the southwest section, with the two-day session divided between North Hollywood and Inglewood.

At this time, the major concern of Valley communities is with the need for speeding up the flow of truck traffic through this area to relieve the present burden on residential and business streets that were never intended for throughway traffic.

Most of the city officials and civic leaders speaking for these communities thought the completion of the Hollywood Freeway would offer the earliest relief from their most pressing problems, although there were some who favored giving priority to the northern end of the San Diego Freeway.

As to the southwest area, so far as their presentation to our committee was concerned, there was complete unanimity among the 10 communities represented at the Inglewood meeting. Their concern is with expediting construction of the San Diego Freeway through this area, and particularly in linking it with the Harbor Freeway from a point north of the International Airport.

Approval of plans and the authorization for the advertising for bids for the air conditioning of the surgeries at Harbor General Hospital was given Tuesday by the Board of Supervisors on recommendation of Chairman Burton W. Chace.

Chace said the work had been recommended by the Superintendent of Charities and the interests of safety and efficiency. According to officials of the hospital, temperatures in the surgeries had reached "excessively high degrees this last summer."

Bids are scheduled to be returned to the County Engineer within 30 days and the contract for construction will probably be awarded within the next two months, Chace announced.
