Moose Lodge Honor Youth, Plan Halloween Affair

The Torrance Moose lodge is issuing a public invitation this week to the other fraternal service and veterans organizations in the Torrance area to join the Moose group in planning independent programs, honoring the teen-agers of Torrance, on "Youth Honor Day", Oct. 31. Nearly all of the 1847 lodges of Loyal Order of Moose fraternity, located throughout the United States are planning programs for the Youth Honor Day observance.

John S. Gibson, Jr., president of the Los Angeles City Council, this week notified Joseph Platt, civic affairs chairman of the Torrance Moose lodge, that Los Angeles would follow the lead of her neighboring city of Torrance by proclaiming "Youth Honor Day."

James McCune, governor of the Torrance Moose, has revealed that his group is planning an admission-free dance for as many teen-agers as the lodge hall can hold. The Halloween dance will be a costume affair, and prizes will be awarded for the most outstanding costumes worn at the dance.

Free admissions tickets may be obtained at the Adult Education Office at Torrance High School or at the door. The lectures give county institute credit to teachers.

Anyone who has completed a Standard First Aid Class within the past three years is eligible to take this training.


Persons interested may register the first night of the class, Wednesday, Oct. 15, in the cafeteria, Fern Ave. School.


