Residents Hit Site Of Dump

Residents of the Carson area have opened a petition drive to protest an application for a rubbish and garbage dump site on Vermont Ave., between 208th and 214th Sts.

Hearing on the application by Bert W. Martin of the Beredo Corp. has been scheduled before the County Regional Planning Commission Oct. 30.

Mrs. Clyde Ward, a board member of the Del Amo Civic Improvement Association, said that members of her organization are circulating petitions in the Carson area to oppose granting of a zone exception for such purposes.

"We're opposed because of odors, rats and health hazards of a dump site. In addition, it will be unsightly and lower property values in the area," she said.


Planning Commission officials said that operation of the garbage dump would be limited. The site under consideration is presently zoned A-1.
