

## Torrance Residents Take Advantage of Braille Books

More blind persons in Torrance may have the free library service of Braille Institute, 741 North Vermont ave., Los Angeles if they apply for it, an announcement said today.

The library now is serving eight visually handicapped Torrance residents, and 1063 throughout Los Angeles county, stated Cecil L. Whitehead, Institute president, a retired Altadena attorney who gives his time to work for the sightless.

Named some of the Torrance library users as: Mrs. Josephine Dewey, 241 W.

220th st.; Richard Meggit, 2902 Onrado st., and Randall Craig Waterman, 1767 Marinette st.

Daron Torrance, five, 16820 Kristin ave. also is enjoying the library service.

Whitehead said all Institute services are free to the blind, for the activity relies on philanthropic contributions and bequests in wills.

Services, he said, also include recreation, education, social welfare, vocational rehabilitation, job placement, free white canes, and printing.

The library costs \$50,000 a year to operate, he stated, and the Institute's entire annual budget exceeds \$300,000.

Books in the library are in Braille and talking book form. They are the property of the Library of Congress, distributed by the Institute as a service to the visually handicapped.

Hundreds of school children are scheduled to tour the building and watch the demonstrations during the morning hours, according to the manager.
