

Council Salary Hike Urged By Northside Association

Pay hikes for the mayor and the City Council have been urged for the second time in as many months.

The latest recommendation that members of the council double their salaries to \$200 a month, was made by the North Torrance Civic Improvement Association.

During September, Jonathan Dunmyer, head of the city employes association, proposed that the councilmen's salaries be hiked from \$1200 to \$4000 a year, and that of the mayor to \$10,000 on a full time basis.

Call Election

In a letter, Mrs. M. Clark, president of the northside association, urged that the salary

issue be placed on the ballot at an election.

"We fully realize the valuable time donated by the mayor and councilmen far beyond the small remuneration now received for this time in behalf of our city government and for the good of our city," wrote Mrs. Clark.


