**10,000 Population 'Town' Cut to Three Dwellers by Nite**

Finishing touches are currently being administered to the only private dwelling at El Camino College, El Camino, Calif., population three. Eighteen vocational carpentry students are building garage facilities at the residence of the college's chief security officer, Walter F. Lonsdale, as a final step in a class project started in Sept., 1957.

**Only Residents**  
Lonsdale, his wife, and daughter are the sole 24-hour citizens of the community which is the college home of more than 10,000 students through a 14-hour period daily. Moreover, the Lonsdales are the only bona fide residents of personal mail addressed through the college post office, which handles the outgoing postal missives for the 10,000 students and some 500 employees on campus.

Construction of the garage for use of the family is under the direction of instructors Joseph S. Dzida and William Peterson.

**Near Stadium**

Chief Lonsdale, his wife Sal, and 17-year-old Linda moved into their new home shortly after its completion in July. Other houses constructed by the carpentry students have been sold at auction and removed from the campus. This particular, house, however, was retained by the college and moved to a small triangular parcel of land west of the football stadium.

Lonsdale's duties require him to be on the campus at all hours, making it necessary for him to live near the school. Living on the campus solves the problem.

The house, a five-room, two bedroom wood frame structure, is "quite comfortable," Mrs. Lonsdale says. According to her, living with the daily hustle and bustle of the 10,000 undergraduates poses no problems. "It's amazing," she says, "how quiet things can be, even during a football game."

Formerly with a private detective agency, Lonsdale has been employed at El Camino since 1956.

**Polio Shots To Be Given Free**

Another non-profit immunization clinic will be held at the Aviation High School Library, Aviation and Manhattan Beach Blvd., on Nov. 25 from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m.


Persons between the ages of 3 months and one hundred years are urged to be inoculated for \$1. First, second, third and booster injections will be available.

All minors under 21 must have either a parent or guardian with them or have written consent.

Persons who have a cold or who have run a temperature within twenty four hours, should not be inoculated at this time.

Because funds are not available for free inoculations, these clinics have been organized by the Dianas, Junior Women's Club of Redondo Beach and are sponsored by the National Foundation of Infantile Paralysis.

There will be no polio inoculations given at the schools this fiscal year.


