### Hahn Blasts Delays in Hospital Construction

With more than two years having elapsed since the voters approved a \$15,400,000 bond issue for the Harbor General Hospital, preliminary plans for the urgently needed project have still not been brought before the Board of Supervisors for approval, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn declared today.

He pointed out that the bond issue was approved by the voters on Nov. 6, 1956 and four architectural firms were assigned to the project a week later.

"In view of the urgency of providing adequate hospital care for the large areas served by the Harbor General Hospital, it seems to me that the plans have been delayed beyond all reason," Supervisor Hahn declared.

"There is no project in Los Angeles County that is in greater need than the Harbor General Hospital. It should have number one priority of all capital projects. The patients are housed in dilapidated, temporary barracks, formerly used by the Army. It is absolutely essential that safe, adequate quarters be built for the patients and the doctors, nurses and other employees," he continued.

"When the public votes approval of a bond issue project it has the right to expect the projects to be carried out promptly and with diligence."

### Welcome Given New Lionesses






