- Thanksgiving, here are three popular recipes:**
- Turkey Tetrazzini**
2 tablespoons butter
3 tablespoons flour
1 cup cream
3 slices onion
spring parsley
1/4 bay leaf
1 clove
salt and pepper
pinch nutmeg
1 cut-up turkey
1/2 cup boiled spaghetti
1/2 cup fresh mushrooms, sauteed
3/4 cup buttered crumbs
1/3 cup parmesan cheese
- Make a cream sauce using the butter, flour, and the cream which has been scalded with the onion slices, parsley, bay leaf and clove. Strain and season to taste with salt and pepper and a pinch of nutmeg. Add the turkey to the smooth, boiling sauce along with the spaghetti and the mushrooms. Blend together and turn into a buttered baking dish. Sprinkle with the crumbs and cheese mixed together and bake in a 375 degree oven until brown. Serves 6.
- Oyster and Turkey Bake**
3 cups cream sauce
1 pint fresh oysters
1 3/4 cup cubed day old bread
3/4 cup cold cut-up turkey
1/2 cup grated parmesan cheese
- Heat the cream sauce. Butter a baking dish and add a layer of oysters, sprinkle with 1/2 cup cubed bread and pour 1 cup of sauce over all. Now add the turkey and repeat with 3/4 cup bread cubes and cup sauce. Add a second layer of oysters and top with additional 3/4 cup bread cubes and remaining sauce. Cover the top with the remaining bread cubes and cheese mixed together. Bake in a 325 degree oven until brown. Serves 6.
- Turkey with Green Olives**
2 tablespoons butter
2 tablespoons flour
1 cup light cream
1/4 cup sauteed mushrooms
1 cup cut-up cold turkey
chopped parsley
6-8 large green olives
salt and pepper
cooked rice
- Blend the melted butter and the flour together, add the cream slowly and simmer stirring constantly until smooth. Season with salt and pepper, add the mushrooms and the turkey and heat until warm through. Add a little parsley and the stoned olives and continue to cook for a few more minutes. Serve on hot boiled rice. Serves 6.
