Artistic abilities of El Camino College students will be on display next week in the art center of the college campus.

The exhibit features 29 oil and water paintings along with drawings and ceramic work. One highly praised contribution is a ceramic chess set, which made use of more than 12 molds before its completion. Another piece of sculptured work is a bust of an 11-year-old girl.

The display comes to El Camino following a showing at the Los Angeles County Fair and a special exhibit in the office of the Los Angeles County School Superintendent.

"We always look forward to starting the year with an exhibit from El Camino College, for we feel that its exhibit sets the standards for the remainder of the year," said Robert Troutman, assistant superintendent, Los Angeles county schools.

Urge Storm Plans Be Ready when Money Available

Torrance officials were advised to begin now to make plans for flood control projects to be financed out of the \$225,000,000 countywide bond issue passed in the Nov. 4 election.

H. E. Hedger, chief engineer of the County Flood Control District said that bids for the jobs will be called in the order that plans and specifications are received. He also pointed out that it will take six months before the bonds can be sold.

Torrance stands to receive approximately \$3,000,000 as its share of the funds. The projects here include Walteria Lake drainage through a 35-acre sump, in Hollywood Riviera and downtown.
