





## Float Donations Topped by Mounted Police Gift

A \$250 check from the Torrance Mounted Police led the parade of donations for Torrance's entry in the Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena on New Year's Day.

President Vergel Bolles of the Mounted Police said: "Residents have always supported our Rodeo, and this check for \$250 from receipts of the 1958 Ranchera Days Rodeo is our return gift." Bolles and Rodeo Chairman Lt. D. C. Cook presented the check to Chamber President Fred W. Mill who accepted it on behalf of the Torrance Tournament of Roses Association.

Other checks received this week were from Torrance Junior Chamber of Commerce; Joe H. Peters, Manager, Courtesy Realty; Torrance Electric Shop; William K. Bryant, D.D.S.; Boris S. Woolley; Seeman Studio; BMW Mfg. Co., Inc.; Sam Levy; Manuel L. Rocha; Edgar M. Wilson; Al Gianni; Higgins Brick and Co.; Property Management Corp.; Ralph R. Carroll and Philip M. Halloran. Close to \$3000 is still needed to support this year's float which will be much larger than last year's initial effort, according to Chamber's Float Chairman, George A. Bradford.

Meanwhile, some 4000 letters were mailed from the Chamber office asking for support. "Float Decorations" Chairman, Mrs. Victor E. Benstead, Jr., said that she is being swamped with requests by civic-minded individuals to decorate the float.

## Forgery Suspect Arrested

A forgery suspect accused of passing more than \$2700 of phony checks has been arrested in Virginia, and Torrance police today prepared to bring him back here for trial.

The suspect, identified as William C. Boyd, 31, abandoned his bride of five weeks here while he and another woman and her three children took off across the country, police said.

Part of the money received from the checks was used to purchase a late model Cadillac.

Det. Sgt. Mickey Flicher announced that Fairfax County, Va., police nabbed Boyd on a warrant received by Torrance police from the district attorney's office.

The warrant charges Boyd with eight counts of forgery and one count of burglary.

The checks were stolen from the Louis C. Dunn Construction Co., contractors in the Del Amo Shopping Center on Veterans Day. The checks were passed during the next three days, all but one for more than \$200 each. Until he left Torrance, Boyd, a welder, resided in a hotel at 218th St. and Cabrillo Ave.

Police said the family of the woman who accompanied Boyd resides in Virginia. The woman also claims she had no idea that the trip was allegedly financed by the forged checks.

Two young bicyclists grabbed a purse from the hand of Mrs. Suzy Simpson, 65, of 927 Arlington Ave., but dropped it a few feet farther on.

Mrs. Simpson was pushing a baby stroller through an alley between Cravens and Arlington Aves., when the boys grabbed the handbag.

## Church Burglar Sought


