**Explorer Program to Start Next Year for Teenagers**

More than 1500 adults in the Los Angeles Area Council, Boy Scouts of America, are now being trained to administer an exciting new program for teenage boys, which will be launched in January by the Boy Scouts of America.  
The new program is based on a nationwide survey of teenagers conducted by the University of Michigan.  
It is called Exploring, because boys will have the opportunity to explore fields of interest to them, from aerodynamics and biology to skin diving and auto mechanics.  
Explorer Posts will have the opportunity to specialize for a few weeks or several years in any subject which interests the members. They will be aided by a Consultant, who is an authority in the field in which the Explorers are interested.  
In addition to specializing, Explorers will suggest and help plan their own larger activities through their representatives to District Cabinets and a Council Cabinet.  
Each of the 13 Districts in the Los Angeles Area Council is now training its Explorer advisers, committeemen and parents in the new program. Within two months 1500 adults will have been through a three-session training course on the new program.  
The training is being done in each district by a team of "Explorer trainers" who attended a two-day conference recently at Firestone Scout Reservation.  
Exploring is designed for boys 14 to 18, regardless of whether they have been Boy Scouts.

Hill, Torrance, marshal; Ernest Oakes Jr., San Pedro, senior steward; Robert J. Rudge, Palms Verdes Estates, junior steward; and Fred A. Barton, Rolling Hills, tiler.  
The lodge was chartered Nov. 23, 1957.

**Torrance Tied With Gardena in Chest Campaign**

The Torrance Community Chest campaign, entering its final phase with 86.45% of its total goal collected, is at the moment tied with the Gardena campaign at 86.41% for top place in the Harbor Area.  
The Torrance residential division was the second to make 100% of its goal by last week end. Gardena which had an original lead was third to report 100% following Torrance by one day.  
Commerce and industry division in Torrance are tied with the other Harbor cities with 84.27% of goal reported with \$2,326 yet to be raised. The advance gifts division reported 76% of quota and the small business division reported with only 51% of its \$1,257 goal.
