Wickstrom, Casimir School vice principal, will take over at Hamilton School, 2606 W. 182nd St. Richard Brown, Steele School vice principal, will become principal at Yukon School, 17815 Yukon Ave. Edwin Brown, El Nido principal, will head Magruder School, 4100 W. 185th St. El Nido School will close with the opening of Magruder.

A native of San Pedro, Wickstrom grew up in Lomita and graduated from Narbonne High School, where he was student body president. A graduate of the University of Southern California, he is a former trumpet player with the Long Beach Symphony. He is a Navy veteran.

Wickstrom, 31, started with the Torrance schools in 1950 as a teacher at Walteria and later at Meadow Park School. He has been vice principal at Madrona and Casimir Schools. Married and the father of two children.

Schools Need 60 Additional Teachers in '59

Some 60 new teachers will be needed to handle the increased number of children in Torrance schools next year, according to a report received by the Board of Education Tuesday.

Preliminary estimates indicate that more than 25,000 children will enroll. To handle this load, an additional 44 elementary and 16 high school teachers will be needed, bringing the total number of teachers in the district to nearly 1,000.

The personnel department probably will have to hire about 100 more teachers, including the 60 new ones and replacements for those who leave at the end of the year. This figure is based on past experience of Torrance and other districts.


