

School Board Approves Victor Tract Annexation

Recommendation of a plan to bring the Victor Tract to the Torrance Unified School District was voted by the Board of Education last week.

The board voted to send a letter to the Board of Supervisors which set the school boundaries, approving transfer of the area from the Redondo Beach elementary and South Bay high school districts to the Torrance Unified School District. The area was annexed to Torrance in 1956, but remained a part of the Redondo School District. Redondo and South Bay board already have recommended the change.

A majority of the residents of the area have petitioned the County Superintendent of Schools to transfer the area to Torrance.

Although the annexation will mean more children and another elementary school to be built, the board indicated that it felt that the boundaries of the city and school district should be the same, if possible.

Since a new elementary school will be needed for the area, it probably would be to the district's advantage to be able to obtain the site now, before land values increase. The site for proposed West High School is located in the Victor Tract.

The area should be a financial asset to the district, according to indications for future development. Superintendent J. H. Hull told the board. The Board of Supervisors must approve the change in boundaries by Feb. 1, if the area is to become a part of the Torrance school system for the 1959-60 school year.

The Victor Tract is bounded by Torrance Blvd., Del Amo, Hawthorne, and the Redondo Beach boundary.

School Calendar Adopted by Board

Torrance schools will open on Sept. 10, 1959, and close on June 10, 1960. The Torrance Board of Education decided Tuesday night.

The board adopted a 176-day calendar for the 1959-60 school year. This is the same length as the current school year and one more day than is required by law.

After discussion at its last meeting, the board decided to move the starting date from Sept. 17 to Sept. 10 so that schools would start earlier and get out earlier in the summer.
