### Pianist Is Featured Soloist at Youth Concert Here Today

Pianist Leonard Pennario will be the featured soloist in the second concert of the Joint Youth Band-Artist Concert series to be presented today at 8 p. m. in the Torrance High School Auditorium.

The band portion of the concert will include the "Procession of Nobles" by Rimsky-Korsakov, "Symphonic Suite" by Clifton Williams, Concerto No. 3 by Mozart, played by Tom Greer, student soloist, "Maderia" by Maximiano de Sousa and "Victory at Sea" by Richard Rodgers.

Numbers to be performed by Pennario, who has made numerous recordings, include the Sonata in C, by Mozart, Prelude, Chorale and Fugue by Franck, Dedications by Schumann-Liest, Scherzo in B-flat minor by Cho-

pin, Arabesque by Debussy and the Caprice Espagnol by Moskovski.
