The pickets appeared following a contract dispute between the firm which makes aircraft hydraulic systems, and the International Union of Radio, Electrical Machine Workers.

Company spokesmen said that salaried and some production employees reported for work.

A majority of the company's production workers voted for representation by the union in a National Labor Relations Board election last fall, but the company and union have been unable to iron out undisclosed contract conditions.

Last year the employees rejected representation by the United Auto Workers in an NLRB election.
