Pre-Opening Fete Launches New Broadway Del Amo Store

A charity fashion show for the Harbor General Hospital to be held this Sunday evening will mark the pre-opening of the newly completed Broadway Department Store in the Del Amo Shopping Center at Sepulveda and Hawthorne Blvds. The Broadway will open officially Monday morning with gala festivities and ribbon-cutting ceremonies plan-

ned for the event. First to open in Del Amo, the second largest shopping center in the nation, the Broadway will command one of the two key positions in the center, encompassing 225,000 square feet of building area within a three-story structure. Provisions have been incorporated by the architects, Welton Becket & Associates, to enable construction of a fourth floor in addition in the future, increasing the store area to 270,000 square feet.

Broadway will anchor the northern extremity of the center; its counterpart on the south end will be a 250,000 square foot, single-story unit under construction presently for Sears-Roebuck & Company. Broadway Stores purchased the 20-acre site, upon which they have erected their merchandising facility, from the Del Amo Estate Company. Negotiations were handled by Coldwell, Banker & Company, Real-

tors. A 5,000 square foot basement area under the Broadway Store links it to a truck-tunnel, running the full length of the 600 foot store-mall. This tunnel will serve all the tenants of the center for delivery and refuse disposal, keeping trucks completely divorced from the customer's parking areas. Parking areas will be maintained jointly by all the tenants of the center, and will accommodate over 7000 automobiles. This is probably the only commercial parking lot in the world boasting the existence of producing oil wells. Fenced, and painted freshly in blue and yellow, there are a total of seven producers.

The Del Amo Center, with the Broadway Stores and Sears-Roebuck & Company as its major tenants, has attracted many fine, established chain operations proposing location in the progressive Torrance area. Coldwell, Banker & Company, exclusive lease agents for the center, are presently working out final details with many of these first-class merchandising firms. Cost of the center will be in excess of \$40,000,000, and in a classic design. Equally balanced at either end by Broadway and Sears, the mall stores will form an unbroken chain of building structure having equally attractive east and west entrances. The 85 acre center is owned by the Del Amo Estate Company, who, in addition, control over 150 acres of adjacent property, which in time will become the "Miracle Mile" of Hawthorne Blvd.
