El Camino Enrolls 11,000 Scholars

"Now in its twelfth year, El Camino College has magnified its original enrollment tenfold," Dr. Stuart E. Marsee, president of the campuses of three neighboring high schools in Inglewood, organized in 1946, when 1100 students attended classes on of the college, announced today.

Despite the continuous growth in enrollment, the college has kept pace with educational demands of the communities which it serves. Recognizing the potentials of El Camino, the Board of Trustees and the administrative staff have outlined instructional essentials in harmony with rising enrollment. On three occasions, the public has demonstrated its faith in the community college by approving the "pay-as-you-go" method of financing at the

polls.

Facility Added

This vote has enabled the college to construct a total of fifteen permanent classroom buildings. A new applied arts structure to be completed this year will house classrooms for the instruction of cosmetology, engineering and architectural drafting, police science, pattern making and power sewing. The new building will appear in the area formerly occupied by the maintenance yards on the campus.

Designed as a loft-type building, the applied arts facility will permit removal or changing of interior walls to accommodate needs of the future. With an interior width of 84 feet, the building will initially offer 33,000 square feet for instructional purposes. As needs develop, this may be expanded easily to 80,000 feet.

Mechanical ventilation and artificial lighting will be utilized in the building, which is designed as a series of 21 bays, each with steel columns for structural support. Walls and floors and a 12-foot cantilevered balcony to be used as a passageway.

Permanent maintenance facilities for the college were com-

pleted recently at the northwestern corner of the campus.

New Building in Use

Newest of the buildings to be put into use is the Men's Physical Education building, which will provide long-needed shower and locker facilities for men. Completion of this structure will enable men to vacate a section of the Women's Gymnasium which has been utilized by men since 1949.

Space for members of the physical education staff and gymnastic equipment is also provided. Design of the building is contemporary modern to fit in with the general architectural plan of the campus. A twelve-foot aluminum has relief of a Warrior, the gift of the Associated Students, graces the east side of the building, located just north of the Women's Gymnasium and the college pools.

In 1957 a new 30-classroom structure was completed in time to accommodate new enrollment demands. Chemistry and physics buildings are also among the recently-completed facilities opened to students.

Continuation of the building program to meet the registration demands of the community is assured through 1962. Voters approved financing on the present basis at the polls in May, 1957.

Recent additions are the Campus Theater, Pools, Health Center, Music Building and Art

Public Uses Facilities

Many of the campus facilities are utilized by the public. Throughout the year, swimming pools are open for several hours each week for recreational swimming by the public. During the summer months, a full-time program of instruction is offered, classes being given to the public during both day and evening hours, with recreational hours being offered when classes are not in session.

Services to students have been multiplied since the addition of the new Health Center. With the new facility, nearly any type of emergency ailment of injury may be handled on campus. Offices for the nurse and doctor, as well as an emergency room, therapy room, rest room facilities, and eight examination rooms are included in the structure.

Campus Theater Active

The Campus Theater, which seats 354 persons, was opened in February, 1956. Several of the actors in the first theater production, "The Happy Time,"

are now prominent in the professional theater.

After a year on the Leuzinger High School campus in 1947, the college moved to its own 90-acre campus on Crenshaw between Manhattan Beach and Redondo Beach blvds. on May 27, 1948. Classes were originally held in bungalows moved from military installations; of the original barrack-type buildings, some are still utilized for instructional purposes.

Honors have come to El Camino College in large measure. First place in national competition was won during the past year by Bert Dumais, whose oral interpretation performance at Hutchinson, Kansas, brought new honors to the many established by the public speaking department.
