
**Driver Arrested**

A northside housewife was arrested on a drunk charge Wednesday night after she allegedly abandoned her car where it had struck a fence at 18105 Prairie Ave.


Police arrested Mrs. Martha Elaine Fahrni, 28, of 4106 West 178th St., after tracing the registration on the car.
