COUNTY IMPROVEMENT NO. 2034 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF SANITARY SEWERS

IN 222ND STREET (A PRIVATE STREET) AND OTHER RIGHTS OF WAY AND THE ANNEXATION OF THE TERRITORY WITHIN WHICH THE IMPROVEMENT IS TO BE CONSTRUCTED TO THE DOMINGUEZ SEWER MAINTENANCE DISTRICT

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, State of California, has on file and spread upon the minutes of the Board, a report from the Health Officer of the County recommending the institution of proceedings for the improvement as a health measure; and

WHEREAS, the Board has found and determined by resolution that the public interest requires the construction of sanitary sewers in 222ND STREET (A PRIVATE STREET) and other rights of way and that the improvement is necessary as a health measure; and WHEREAS, provisions have not otherwise been made for the maintenance and repair of sewers within the district, to be improved; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, State of California, as follows: SECTION 1.

That the public interest and necessity require and that it is the intention of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, State of California, to order the following work to be done First: The construction of sanitary sewers and appurtenances in

THE SANITARY SEWER RIGHTS OF WAY IN THE PRIVATE STREET KNOWN AS JAY STREET between MEYLER STREET and the easterly line of Lot 24, Tract No. 3239, as shown on map recorded in Book 37, Pages 27 and 28 of Maps; and in

THE SANITARY SEWER RIGHTS OF WAY IN PRIVATE STREET KNOWN AS 222ND STREET between MEYLER STREET and the easterly line of Lot 29, above-mentioned Tract No. 3239; and in

223RD STREET in the intersection thereof with MEYLER STREET; and in

MEYLER STREET between a line parallel with and approximately 200 feet northerly, measured at right angles, from the southerly line of abovementioned Lot 24 and a line parallel with and approximately 5 feet southerly, measured at right angles, from said southerly line of Lot 24 and between the northerly line of the SANITARY SEWER

RIGHTS OF WAY IN THE PRIVATE STREET KNOWN AS 222ND STREET and the southerly line of 223RD STREET.

Second: The resurfacing of the trench in the streets and rights of way wherein aforementioned sanitary sewers are constructed.

All of said work shall be performed in the streets and rights of way and between the limits, hereinafter designated except where the plans indicate that said work shall be omitted.

THAT SUCH WORK OR IMPROVEMENT, IT IS ESTIMATED, WILL COST THE SUM OF TWENTY-ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$21,000).

SECTION 2

That all the work and improvements aforesaid shall be done and performed as shown on and in accordance with and to the grades shown on the plans, profiles and specifications therefor, filed in the office of the Board of Supervisors in the Hall of Records in the City of Los Angeles on the 10th day of March, 1959. Reference is hereby made to said plans, profiles and specifications for a full and detailed description of said proposed work or improvement, and said plans, profiles and specifications shall govern for all details of the proposed work or improvement and for the description of the grade to which this work is to be done, and are deemed a part hereof.

SECTION 3

That the said contemplated work or improvement, in the opinion of the Board, is of more than local or ordinary public benefit, and the Board hereby makes the expense of the work or improvement chargeable upon a district, which district the Board declares to be the district benefited by the work or improvement and to be assessed to pay the cost and expense thereof.

A map of the improvement district, indicating by a boundary line the extent of the territory included in the proposed district approved by the Board on the 10th day of March, 1959, is on file in the office of the Board. Reference is hereby made to the map for a full and complete description of the property to be assessed to pay the cost of the improvement and the map shall govern for all details as to the extent of the assessment district.

That serial bonds shall be issued in accordance with Division 7, Streets and Highways Code, to represent each assessment of fifty dollars (\$50.00) or more remaining unpaid for thirty (30) days after the date of the recording of the warrant. The serial bonds shall extend over a period ending nine (9) years from the second day of January next succeeding the next October fifteenth following their date, and shall bear interest at the rate of six (6) per cent per annum on all sums unpaid, until the whole of the principal and interest is paid.

The principal sum shall become due and payable in equal annual payments on the 15th day of each November succeeding the October 15th following their date until fully paid.

The first interest payment shall be payable on the 15th day of May next succeeding the April 15th or the 15th day of November next succeeding the October 15th, as the case may be, next follow-

ing the date of the bonds. The following interest payments shall be for six months interest and shall be payable on each fifteenth day of May and November; the last interest payment coming due 45 days before the last annual payment of the principal.

SECTION 5

The Streets hereinbefore referred to are public streets in the County of Los Angeles and are located in unincorporated territory in the vicinity of Torrance.

SECTION 6

That it is the opinion of the Board that the public interest will not be served by allowing the property owners to take the contract for the work to be done under these proceedings.

SECTION 7

That it is hereby found and determined that provisions have not otherwise been made for the maintenance and repair of sewers in the territory within which said improvement is to be constructed and that upon completion of construction of said improvement said territory will be in need of sewer maintenance and should be annexed to an existing sewer maintenance district.

SECTION 8

That the public interest, convenience and necessity require, and it is the further intention of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles to order annexed to, included with, and known as unincorporated territory of said County included within the following described exterior boundary lines:

SECTION 9

Beginning at the southeasterly corner of Lot 29 of Tract No. 3239, as shown on map recorded in Book 37, pages 27 and 28 of Maps, in the office of the Recorder of the County of Los Angeles; of said lot to an angle point in the boundary of Dominguez Sewer Maintenance District, as same existed on February 3, 1959; thence westerly along said boundary and following the same in all its various courses to the point of beginning.

SECTION 10

That the proceedings for the aforesaid work or improvement and the annexation of territory to said Maintenance District shall be under and in accordance with Division 7, Streets and Highways Code and Los Angeles County Ordinance No. 4348 providing that within 30 days from the recording thereof, shall be made to the County Engineer.

SECTION 11

That Thursday, the 16th day of April, 1959, at the hour of 9:30 a.m. of said day, is the day and hour and the Chambers of the Board in the Hall of Records, in the City of Los Angeles, is the place fixed by the Board when and where any and all persons having any objections to the proposed work or improvement or to the extent of the work to be done, or to the proposed annexation or to the inclusion of any property within the proposed annexation, or to any or all of the foregoing, may appear before the Board and show cause why the proposed work or improvement or annexation should not be carried out in accordance with this Resolution.

SECTION 12

That the County Engineer shall cause to be conspicuously posted along the line of the contemplated work or improvement and along all open streets within the district liable to be assessed for the improvement, notices of the adoption of this Resolution in the manner and in the form required by law.

SECTION 13

That the Clerk of the Board shall cause to be posted conspicuously in at least three public places in the said Dominguez Sewer Maintenance District, notices of the proposed annexation of said territory in the manner and in the form required by law.

SECTION 14

The Clerk of the Board shall certify to the adoption of this Resolution and shall cause the same to be published once a week for two successive weeks in the Torrance Press a newspaper of general circulation in the improvement district and in the Dominguez Sewer Maintenance District, which newspaper is hereby designated as the newspaper most likely to give notice of the proposed improvement and annexation and the hearing thereon to the inhabitants.

SECTION 15

The Board does hereby direct the Clerk thereof to mail notices of the adoption of this Resolution of Intention to all persons owning real property proposed to be assessed for the construction of the improvement herein described whose names and addresses appear on the last equalized assessment roll of the County of Los Angeles or as known to the Clerk, the contents of said notices to be as required by law.

The foregoing resolution was on the 10th day of March, 1959, adopted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, State of California.

Efficiency Tests in Trash Collection Undertaken Here

Ways of cutting the cost of the city's municipal rubbish collection program may be tested this week, Chapman L. Bone, assistant city manager, announced.

He said that trial runs of two-man crews, to be compared with the efficiency of the present three-man crews per truck are to be one of the portions of the evaluation.

Bone said that if it is shown that municipal operation will continue to be considerably higher than private collection, a recommendation to contract the work may be made.

A report for the city operation during 1958 revealed that it cost the city \$159,563 from general funds above the revenue received from the \$1 monthly collection charge.

The survey also disclosed that it costs the city \$1.80 per month for the service it provides for \$1.

The city presently pays \$300,000 per year for disposal.

which includes \$102,000 it pays George Green, a private contractor, for collection of garbage and non-combustible trash.

Bone said purpose of the trial runs is to determine if the city's program can be operated more economically, such as by use of two-man crews, equipment or schedule changes.

He said result of the tests will be submitted to the City Council next month.

The councilmen had ordered officials to determine how cost of the rubbish collection program can be cut and to furnish it with interim reports.

New School Union May Be Granted Dues Deductions

If the Torrance Board of Education approves additions to its policy covering employee organizations Tuesday, School Superintendent J. H. Hull said yesterday that he will recommend that a newly-formed employee union be granted payroll deductions.

The board already has a policy offering employees freedom of choice in employee organizations. The addition to the policy would provide that such organizations will be recognized by the board if they present a list of the local officers, members, and employees to the board, together with a copy of their charter or other official document.

Late Tuesday, Hull received a list containing 130 names of employees who have joined the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees, Local 1101. He also received a list of the temporary officers.

The district has some 340 non-teaching employees and an additional 100 cafeteria workers. "First indications are that the group qualifies for recognition if the board chooses," Hull said. "If this is so, I will recommend that the union be allowed payroll deductions."

Comment on the union, he noted, "Apparently the union feels that it will be able to achieve better conditions than in the past. The president of the new union, for instance, is an electrician who has differed with the district as to the need for electrician's helpers."


Registration will begin at 12:30 and school will open at 1:30. Following dinner will be served to members in the Elks hall. Reservations for dinner must be made by March 25.
