A street lighting program for North Torrance will be kicked off at a May 7 meeting to combat thieves, prowlers and traffic accidents which have besieged dark areas.

The meeting, called by the North Torrance Civic Improvement Association, will be held at McMaster Park at 7:30 p. m.

"North Torrance home owners have been continually terrorized by persistent prowlers and burglars this year. Despite the best efforts on the part of

(the police department, the menace persists in some areas," declared Barbara Morgan, publicity chairman.

She continued that the solution lies not in one, but many measures, but that well lighted streets are certainly not conducive to thieves and prowlers.

"We don't propose to be traffic experts by any means, but we do feel that our efforts to interest the home owners in North Torrance in securing adequate street lighting may contribute appreciably to the ov-

Rattler Centers Set up

Special rattlesnake emergency centers have been set up by the Bay Harbor Osteopathic Society as a result of an unusually high incidence of snakes in the Palos Verdes Hills, and Hollywood Riviera.

Several bites have already been reported, the Society said. It announced that the hot dry weather, coupled with construction projects in the hills has produced a large crop of rattlesnakes this year.

The Society said in the last two years, rattlers have been reported as far north as 190th St.

Osteopathic emergency centers have been established in Pacific View Hospital, Hermosa Beach, Pacific Medical Center, Redondo Beach, Family Medical Clinic, Redondo Beach, Hillside Emergency Center, 26309 S. Western Ave., Lomita, and South Bay Emergency Hospital, 2114 Redondo Beach.

Physicians also have emergency advice for persons bitten by the snakes, if it is definitely identified as a rattler. They say the bite is usually identified by two small puncture marks. Marked burning pain, swelling and discoloration, (black and purple) appear.

They say a tourniquet should be applied above the bite immediately, coffee administered, and the bite area immersed in ice if possible. No alcoholic beverages should be given. After the first aid, immediate medical treatment should be sought.
